#### Purpose of Federal Programs & Grants

**Title I** – funds to provide interventions to support struggling students and family engagement activities.

**Title II-A** – funds to provide professional development for teachers, paraprofessionals, and administrators.

- Support for students on Individual Education Plans (special education)

**Title IV-A** – funds to provide academic support and student enrichment

**Title IDEA-B and IDEA Early Childhood Special Education**– funds to support students with disabilities PK-12 (special education).

**Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER)**– funds to helps schools respond to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.
