# Purpose of Federal Funds & Grants

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The U.S. Department of Education gives funding to school districts to provide a variety of programming aimed at helping children succeed academically including:

- Tutoring
- Mentoring
- Summer School/Camps
- Field Trips
- Family Events
- After School Programming
- Health & Wellness (Clinics)
- Counseling
- Computers
- Software
- Professional Development for Staff
- Educational Materials
- College Visits
- Career Exploration
- Preschool
- Clothing and School Supplies



# Strategic Plan & Funding Alignment

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The spending of Federal Funds & Grants must be aligned to the district's strategic plan. All spending is aligned to support the following goal:

*By spring 2025 and beyond, all LCS students PK-12 will be on track for colleges and careers upon graduation from our district. This means that within six months of graduation, our graduates will be ready to either be enrolled in a post-secondary education, secure employment, enroll in an apprenticeship, or enlist in the military.*

# Types of Federal Funds

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**Title I** – funds to provide interventions to support struggling students and family engagement activities.

During 2020-21 and 2021-22, Lorain City Schools has used these funds for the following programs:

- Title I Reading Teacher at each elementary school
- Title I Reading and Math Teacher at each middle school and LHS
- Summer Programming
- Educational Software
- Family Engagement Nights – 4 events at each school

# Types of Federal Funds

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**Title II-A** – funds to provide professional development for teachers, paraprofessionals, and administrators.

During 2020-21 and 2020-22 Lorain City Schools has used these funds for the following training programs:

- Use of Educational Technology
- Equity & Inclusion
- Instructional strategies designed for English Learners
- Support for students on Individual Education Plans (special education)
- Mental Health & Counseling
- Academic Coaching for teachers

# Types of Federal Funds

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**Title III** – funds to support language instruction for English Learners.

During 2020-21 and 2021-22, Lorain City Schools has used these funds for the following staff positions:

- Bilingual Paraprofessionals



# Types of Federal Funds

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**Title IV-A** – funds to provide academic support and student enrichment

During 2020-21 and 2021-22, Lorain City Schools has used these funds for the following programs:

- Educational & College Field Trips
- Mentoring & Social Emotional Learning Programs
- Instructional Materials in Reading
- ACT Testing Fees

# Types of Federal Funds

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**Title IDEA-B and IDEA Early Childhood Special Education**– funds to support students with disabilities PK-12 (special education).

During 2020-21 and 2021-22, Lorain City Schools has used these funds for the following programs:

- Paraprofessionals (salary and benefits)
- Instructional Materials
- Professional Development for staff

# Types of Federal Funds

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**Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER)**– funds to help schools respond to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

During 2020-21 and 2021-22, Lorain City Schools has used these funds for the following programs:

- Technology – laptops, software, and internet access for students and staff
- Summer Camps & Programming
- Arts Expansion
- Roofing & Maintenance – to ensure air quality
- School Supplies
- Masks & Cleaning Supplies
- Community Engagement Events
- Wrap Around Services – mental health supports, clothing, medical needs
- After School Programming
- Learning Loss Recovery – tutoring and academic interventions

# District-Wide Title I Policy

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Lorain City Schools believes that family involvement is critical to the success of its Title I and educational programs. To build a partnership between the home and school the district :
